# Designed to aid in the reduction of anaesthetic drug misadministration






Designed to aid in the reduction of anaesthetic drug misadministration, the Rainbow Trays<sup>™</sup> are colour coded anaesthetic trays for use in operating theatres by anaesthetists supporting the AAGBI and RCoA colour coded critical care labelling system.

The trays provide a safe environment for the transportation, storage and administration of anaesthetic drugs.



The aim of Rainbow Trays<sup>™</sup> is to deliver standardised storage of drugs using a tray that incorporates logical progression integrated with the established international colour coding system for critical care drug labelling without interfering with or confining the normal working practice of individual anaesthetists.



Rainbow Trays<sup>™</sup> have been designed with the collaboration of anaesthetists, pharmacists and healthcare workers in response to the demands of best practice and clinical governance. The design has been tested from conception to deliver improvements for a standardised system to store and transport anaesthetic syringes and ampoules in a secure and supportive environment to assist in the reduction of misadministration of drugs in anaesthesia.

The Rainbow Trays<sup>™</sup> system comprises three separate trays that allow the anaesthetist to clearly separate routine, local and emergency drugs.



The smaller trays are designed to sit beneath the main tray if desired, both saving space and securing these drugs out of accidental use. The sizes of each colour section have been optimized to account for the most probable use of syringe size thereby allowing all syringes to sit comfortably within the sections and are less likely to be relocated. Designed to comfortably integrate into established working practices, the tray is also ideal as a training aid for new anaesthetists.


